Executive Summary

As part of its mandate to conduct refresher courses and theme-based training workshops for serving State Forest Service officers from various State Forest Departments, Central Academy for State Forest Service, (CASFOS) Dehradun organized a six-day Training on **‘Wildlife Management’** from 07th September to 12th September, 2020. This theme-based training being held for in-service SFS officers and senior FROs by the Academy was organized through an online platform, because of COVID-19 situation. A total of **ninety-six (96)** nominations were received from the **twenty-three (23)** States and 89 Officers registered for the training while few could not attend the training.

The **Wildlife Management** module was developed with the experts’ input on the subject and feedback of earlier courses and in-house experience. The methodology followed was online training through Microsoft Teams platform, wherein the participants were registered online through a registration form. Thereafter, all the registered participants were given a link to join the training sessions.

The training was inaugurated with Shri Soumitra Dasgupta IFS, Additional Director General of Forests, MoEFCC, New Delhi as Chief Guest and Shri R.P. Singh, IFS, DFE as Guest of Honor. Dr. AJT John Singh, Wildlife Biologist initiated the training with a session on Wildlife Habitat Management; which was followed by a session on Wildlife Management Planning by Dr. P.K. Mathur, Scientist (Retd); Use of Technology in Wildlife Management by Dr. K. Ramesh, Scientist; Wildlife Laws by Shri P.C. Tyagi, IFS (Retd.); Trade in Wildlife by Dr. Samir Sinha, IFS; Wildlife Management outside PAs by Abhilash Damodaran, IFS; Wild Animal Translocation : An UP Experience by Shri Pinaki Prasad Singh, IFS; Tiger Conservation in India: Way Forward by Dr. S.P. Yadav, IFS; Conservation of Amphibians & Reptiles by Dr. Abhijeet Das, Scientist; Wildlife Health Management by Dr. Aditi Sharma, Sr. Veterinary Officer, Rajaji National Park; Wildlife Forensics by Dr. S.K. Gupta, Scientist; Bird Habitat Management by Dr. Pratap Singh, IFS (Retd.); Relocation & Rehabilitation of People – The Rajaji Experience by Smt. Neena Grewal, IFS; Wetland Management: Issues & Challenges by Dr. Ritesh Kumar, Director, WISA; Wild Animals Capture: Options and Concerns by Dr. Parag Nigam, Scientist; Eco-development strategies in India by Dr. A.K. Bhardwaj, IFS; Wildlife Management in Coastal Areas by Dr. S. Senthil Kumar, IFS; Wildlife Management & Livelihoods by Dr. Sonali Ghosh, IFS. The training concluded with Dr. Rajesh Gopal IFS(Rtd.) as Chief Guest of the Valedictory function.

The soft copies of articles related to the relevant topics covered during the course, apart from the copies of the presentations made by the experts and the recordings of the each session were also provided to each trainee as part of the training kit which was shared through Microsoft Teams.

Overall impact of the training was positive and the feedback and high rating from the participants corroborates the assessment of the organizers.



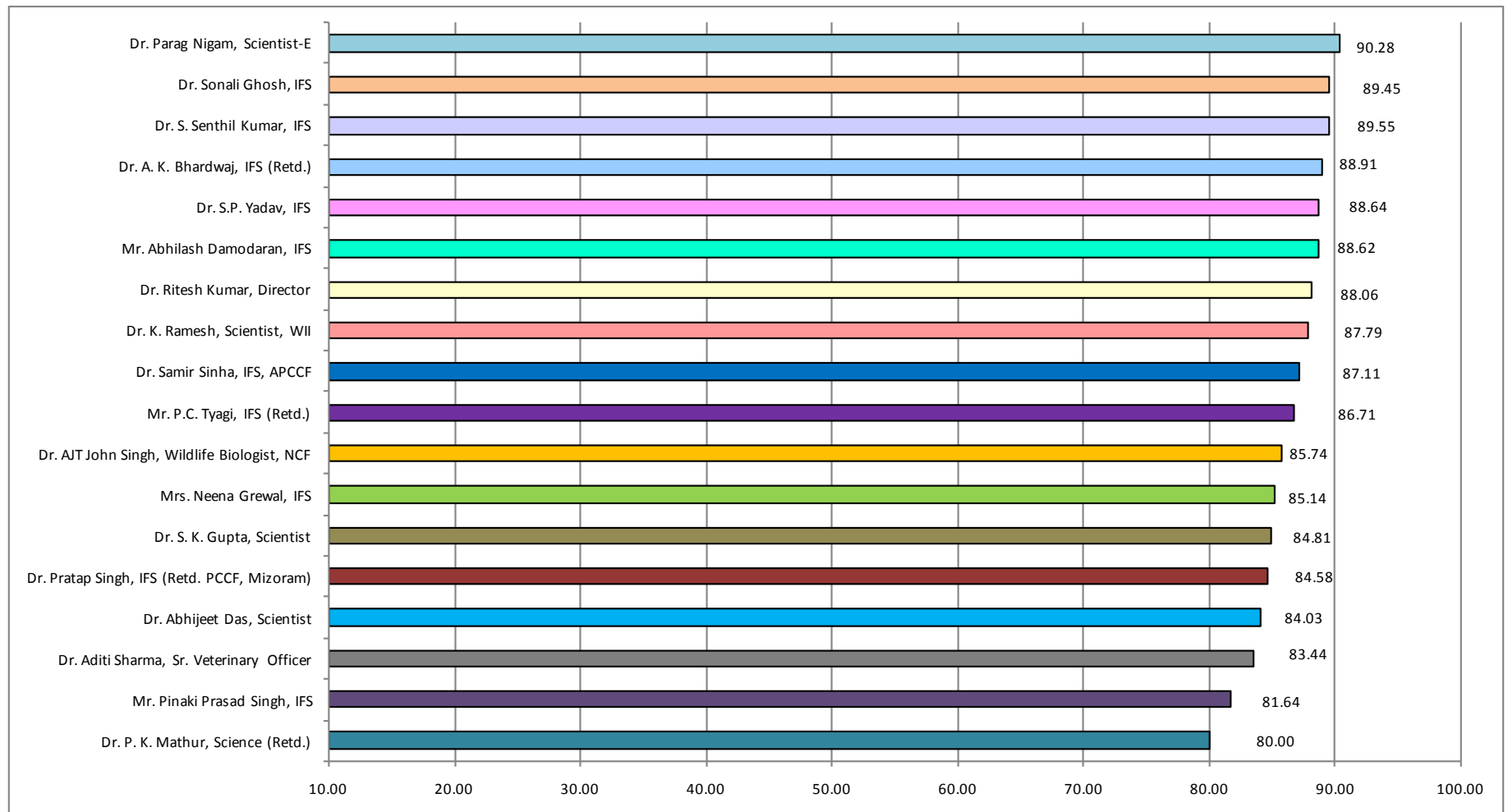

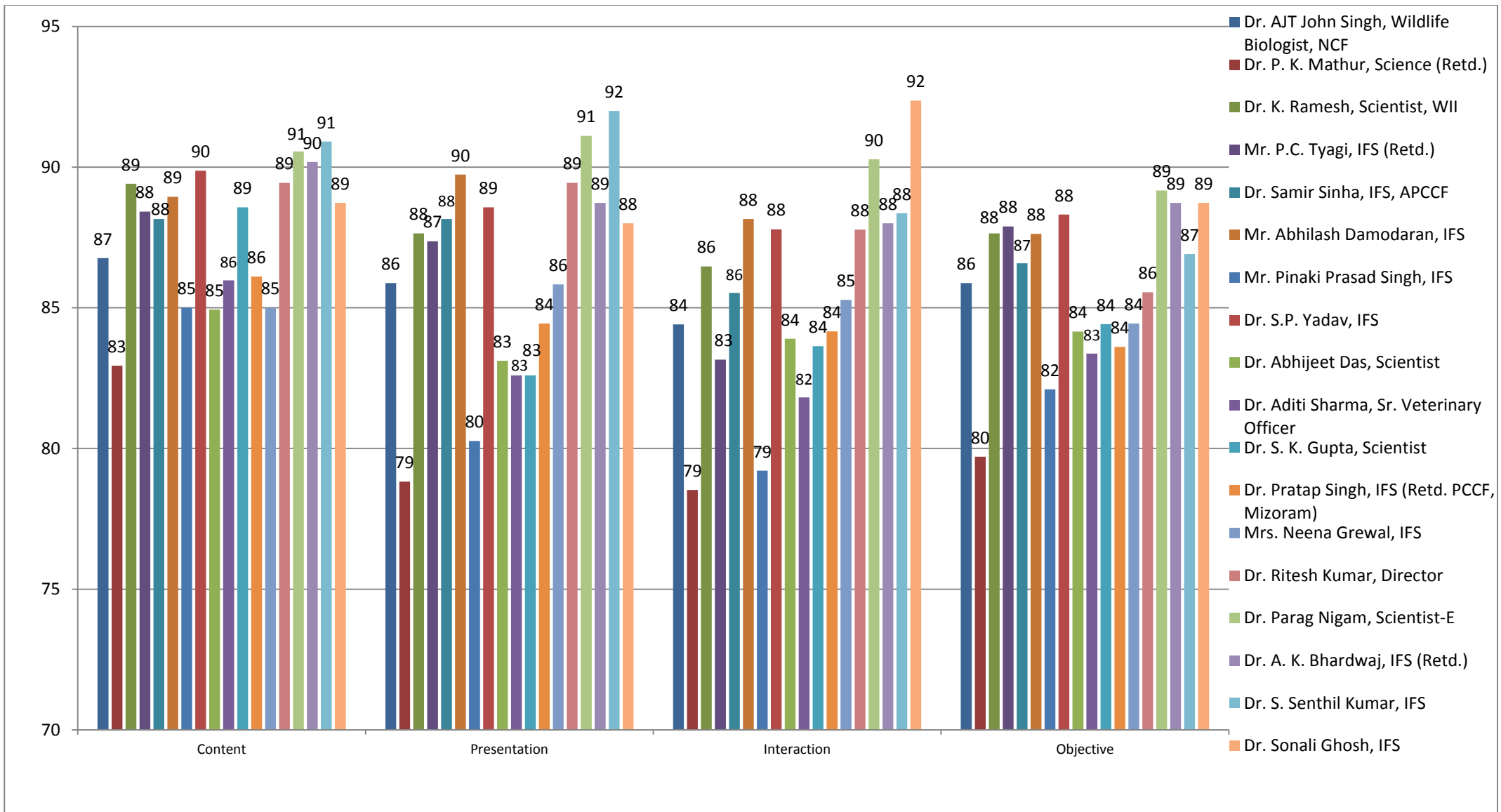

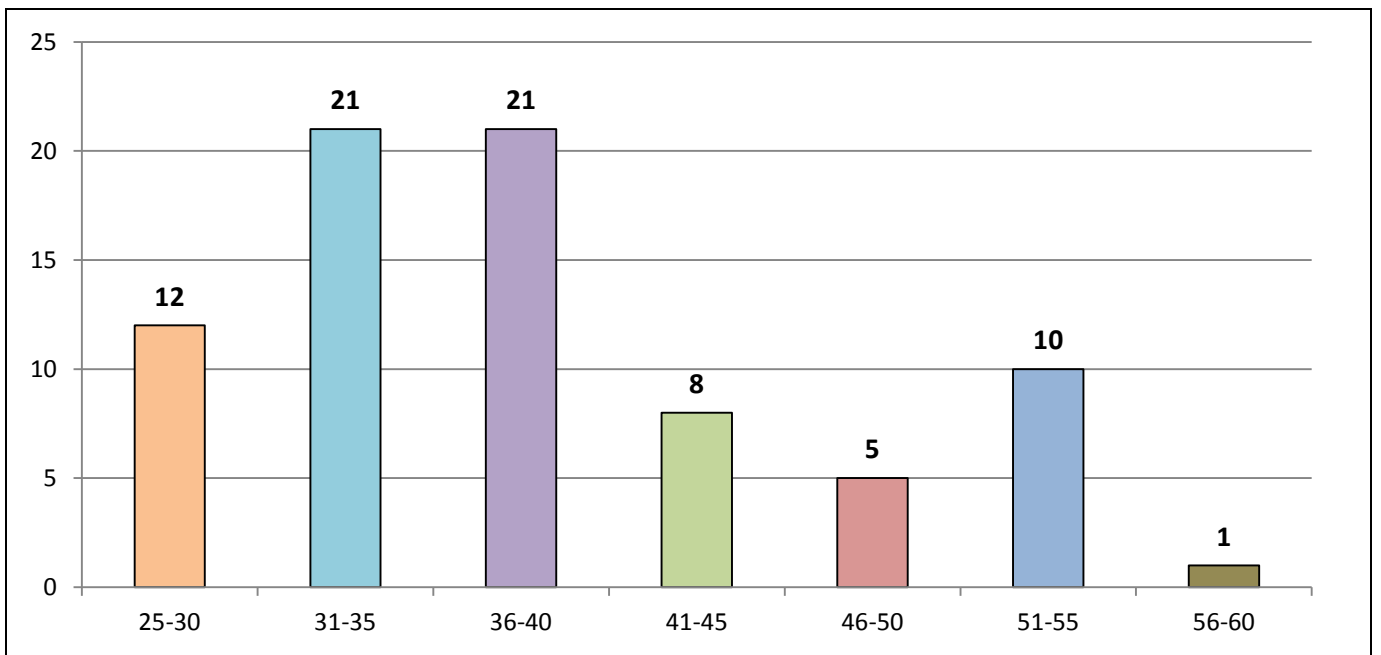

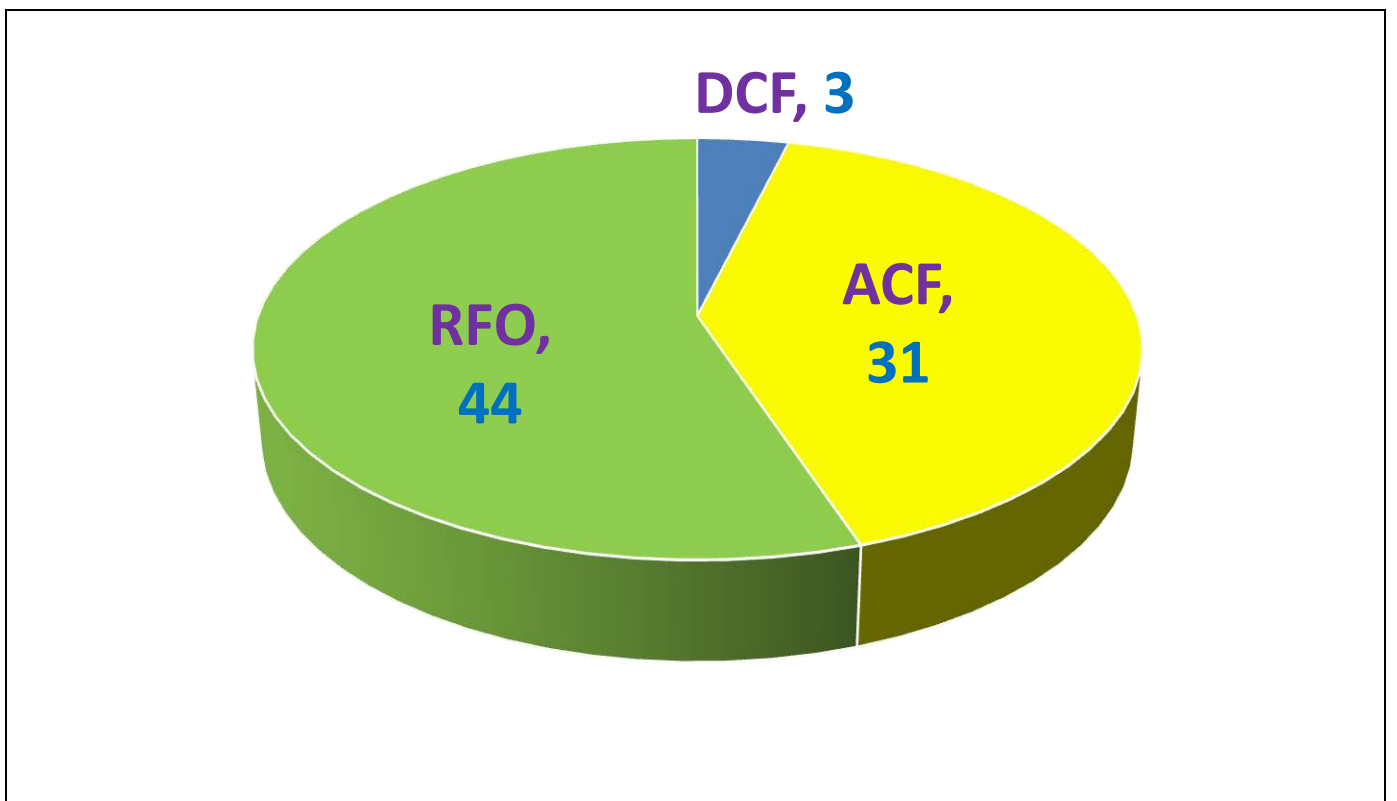
Overall Feedback of Resource Persons on all Parameters



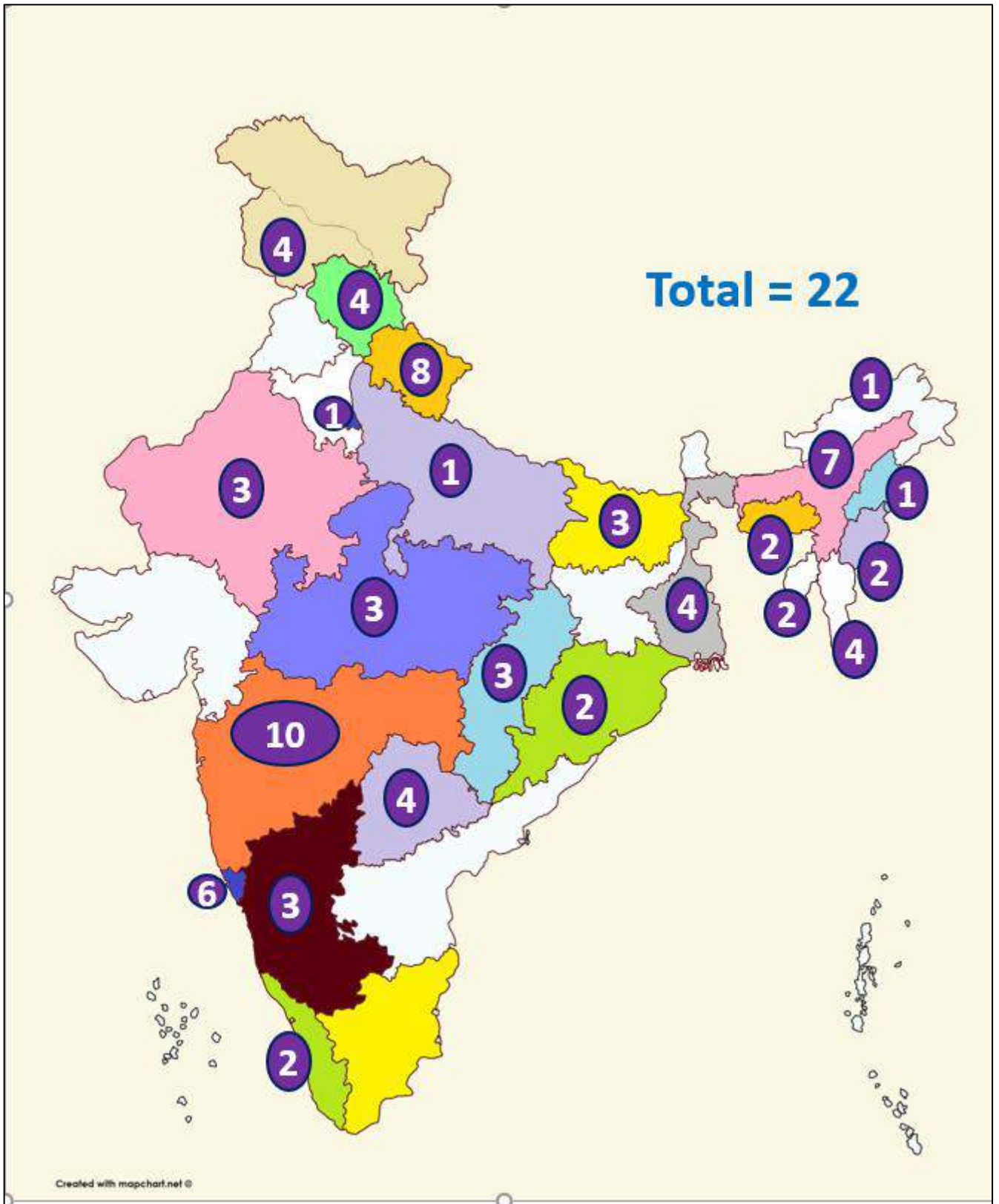
Parameter wise breakup of feedback of Resource Persons
